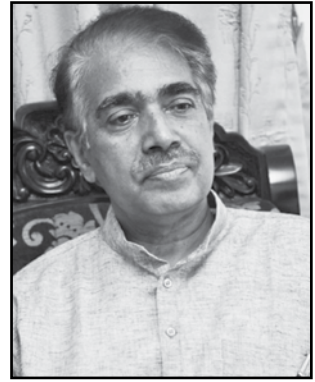


## EDITORIAL



## Ethical Values

Various governments have enacted laws, rules, and guidelines for ethical practices in general and also specific to various professions. Professional associations, industries, NGOs and the like have also prepared ethical code of conduct and professional ethics to be adhered to by professionals belonging to each type of profession. It is also necessary for the teachers of the academic institutions to become aware of this and make their students aware of where the information on these can be obtained in more detail for their own further learning and to live and to contribute as responsible citizens of the Nation, Society and the World.
